Foreword

I have the pleasure of presenting Between the Self and Silhouettes, a duo exhibition of Anjan Modak and Soma Das, which shows a large body of artworks, delineating significant aspects of their creative oeuvre. It is also a moment of personal happiness that we have represented the two talented painters from Bengal since the gallery's inception. This exhibition testifies to our incredible journey of working together.

Although dissimilar in style and temperament, Anjan Modak and Soma Das share a common ground of empathy in their portrayal of the ordinary, manual workers, ranging from construction labourers and street vendors to housemaids. Soma Das depicts them from a unique womanly perspective in a rich narrative style inspired by the Indian miniature paintings. Anjan Modak, on the other hand, captures the valence of dialectics in their lives – pain and pleasure, dreams and despairs, resentment and subordination – in sharp graphic clarity, irony and satire. The idea of labour is central to both of their political imagination. However, instead of glorifying it, they see it as a lens to look deep into the life's fabric of the subaltern people, exploring their complex, layered relationship with the prevailing social conditions. I hope that the art lovers of Kolkata will be enchanted to see their artists' works, who have drawn inspiration from the city's everyday life.

For over three years, Emami Art, one of India's most active and multifaceted art galleries, has been committed to projecting the work of exceptionally talented artists to a global audience. The gallery's activities have expanded beyond exhibition-making, creating a meaningful artistic discourse around it through a yearlong programme of seminars, talks, workshops, residencies, and publications. Between the Self and Silhouettes is a prominent highlight on our gallery's calendar.

I want to thank the artists and Adip Dutta, who has known the artists and their work for a long time, for curating the fantastic show. I also extend my gratitude to our team at Emami Art for their dedication and efforts.

Between the Self and Silhouettes

The self extends itself on to others. A simultaneous acknowledgement of the passerby and recognition of the shadow of one's self falling on the other constitute the connection. The works of Soma Das and Anjan Modak centre around a sense of empathy that accounts for a search of the self under the pretext of watching numerous others situated around the artist. The relentlessness of recording figures in action, not only indicates the circumstances of the subjects, but also that of the artists who take both the role of an insider and an outsider in looking at them. Thus the figures are marked with a sense of attachment and detachment at the same time. The physical distance from the figure being quietly observed with the probing eve of a researcher becomes evident from the subject's comfortable body language. But it is that meticulously constructed single moment in the life of the figure in action, that emotionally connects the artist, especially Soma Das, with the one being watched. Anian, on the other hand weaves the sequences of a latent drama wherein his protagonists perform roles in a poignant visual language. Soma and Anjan, both respond to the site and situation that they share with their protagonists, often as ethnographer-artists, exploring designs of the relationship between people and social conditions. The two artists by virtue of being emotionally connected share the same domestic space which is marked not only by daily chores, but also by several constraints. This space transforms into a site of artistic production, a metaphor of an overlap between the mundane and the celebratory. The process begins with almost compulsive acts of documenting moments that after a point of time begin to transform the banal into the significant. The layout of the exhibition is an attempt to track those passages wherein the artists tread through enumerable silhouettes, looking for the remarkable self.






Represented by Emami Art, over twenty-five paintings by Anjan Modak entitled *The Common Man* were shown in the India Art Fair, New Delhi (2020).


