




Brief Description

Ali Akbar P.N. is a contemporary artist based in Vadodara. He works extensively in collages, videos and artists' books, and his work revolves around memory, identity, alienation, and desire. Ali Akbar was born in a village in Kerala, where most people are engaged in fishing and related occupations. He draws inspiration from the local stories he heard while growing up, the stories of the history of the land and the political narratives of the contemporary time. Most of his recent works have the recurring duality of Obedience/Disobedience, Past/Present and Absence/Presence underlying them. Ali Akbar's practice reflects the growing change in cultural patterns that connects the region to a larger context within the Global South. His subjects often relate to trans-cultural and counter-political narratives formed since the recent decade. There is a kind of coastal imagination of his region, which is often neglected by the traditional mainland-terrestrial imagination.

Ali Akbar's collages explore the connection he develops with mediated images, researching and meticulously collecting pictures published in various print and digital media, which have become essential to his artistic practice. The artist creates an overlapping narrative of history, memory and identity based on digital photos and his works, whether painted or videos. In the artist's book, Ali Akbar plays with the idea of narration. By cutting, overlapping pages and inviting viewers to engage and create their narratives out of the book, Akbar subverts the singular narrative. Instead, he underlines the layered existence within the contemporary image-dominated world.







Brief Bio

Ali Akbar P N. was born in 1996 in Koolimuttam, Central Kerala. The artist obtained his MVA in Painting from Maharaja Sayaji Rao University, Vadodara, Gujarat 2020 and his BFA in Painting from the Govt. College of Fine Arts Thrissur, Kerala 2018.

Ali Akbar reaches into his familial history as lineal fisherfolk and collective memory and subconscious to give anchorage to his practice, encompassing drawings, collages, artists' books, and videos based on his digital photographs. For him, the small coastal village, its natural bounty, the abundant nature of the sea, and its constantly flowing state are essential resources to question the subaltern and marginal. By centring his work around alienation—individual, social, political or religious, Ali Akbar's practice reflects a growing change in cultural patterns that connects the region to a larger context within the Global South.
